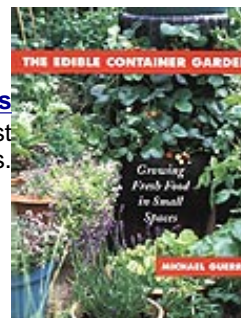

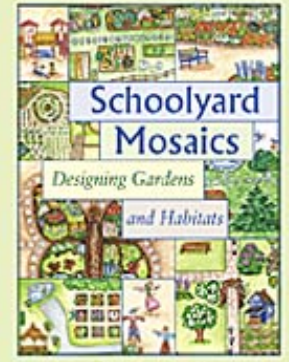
### [EarthBox Planter](#)
